



Immortal Stourhead 10k | Saturday 13th May 2023 | 10:00

Athlete Information

We look forward to welcoming you to Stourhead.

The final preparations are well under way. We need to make you aware of some important information prior to race day.

Location

Stourhead House is in the village of Stourton. There are very clear brown directional signs to Stourhead from the A303 near Mere from the south and the B3092 from the north and then follow the B3092.

Car Parking

Please follow signs to the National Trust Stourhead car park.
You will then be directed to the athlete parking area.

Camping (pre-booked only via the National Trust [Book Camping HERE!](#))

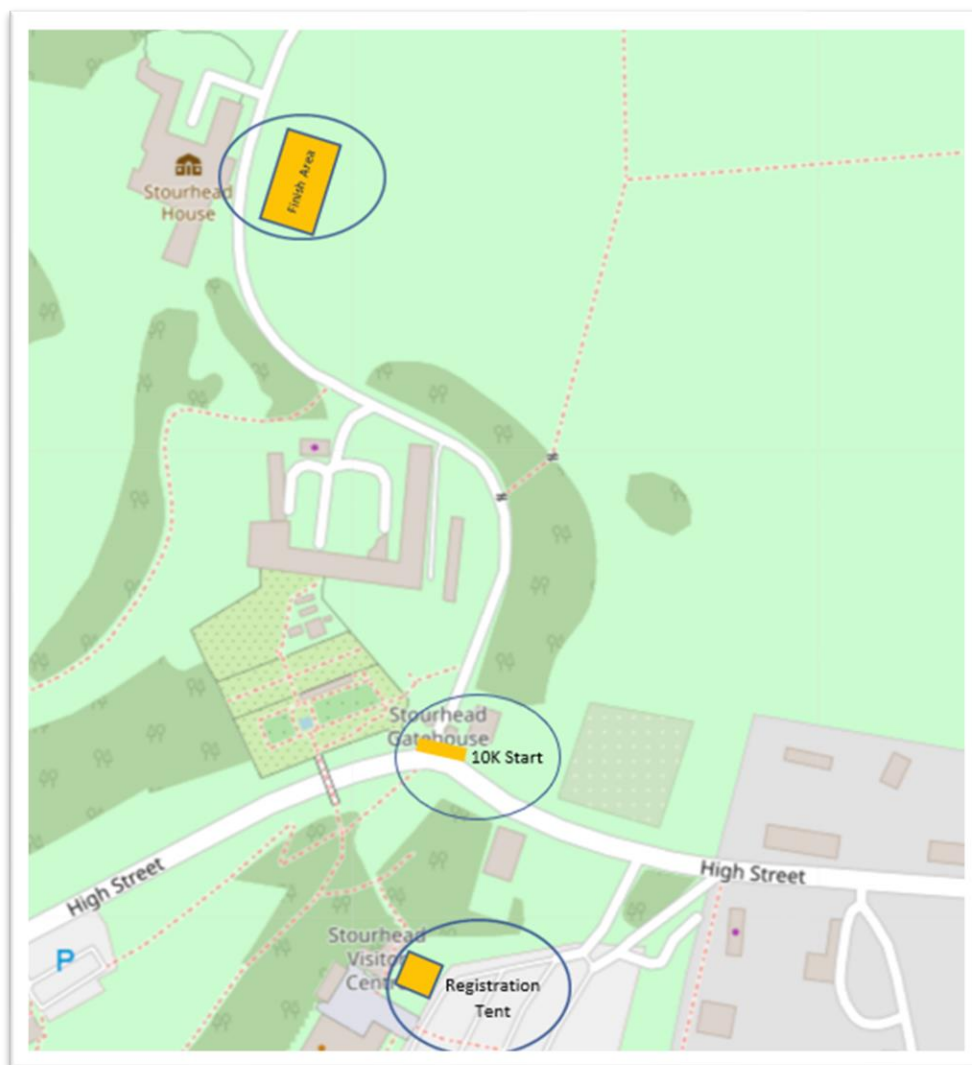
Check in will be from 15:00 - 21:00 on Friday 12th and anytime after 09:00 on Saturday 13th
Please follow the road signs to Stourhead car park and signage will then direct you the short distance to the campsite. A National Trust staff member will be at the entrance to greet you upon arrival.
There will be warm showers and toilets in the camping area (for campers' use only).
Catering will be available from National Trust outlets across the weekend.
No fires are permitted on the camp ground.
These are basic grass pitches with no electric or hard standing.

Catering

Food and drinks will be available to purchase on site throughout the event.

Race Packs

Please ensure you arrive in plenty of time to collect your race pack from the registration tent outside the Stourhead Visitor Centre, registration will be open from 08:00 - 09:30 We will not be posting race packs in advance of the event.



Left Baggage

There will be a left baggage area at the finish marquee outside Stourhead House (not at registration). Please use the tear off label on the bottom of your race number to identify your bag. We cannot take responsibility for any left luggage, please avoid leaving valuables or car keys.

Race Numbers and Shoe Timing Chips

Ensure you fill in the medical information on the reverse of your race number. Your race number must be pinned to the FRONT of your running top; please bring your own safety pins. Failure to start and finish wearing your race number will result in no time or position being recorded. Race numbers do not need to be returned at the end of the race. The timing chip must be attached to your shoe, and will be removed after you have finished.

Toilets

There are toilets near the Visitor Centre and in the basement of Stourhead House.

Race Start and Briefing

The start line is at the archway at the foot of the drive to the house. The race will be timed gun to chip. A short race briefing will be given approximately 5 minutes before the race, which will start at 10:00hrs.

Race Route

The Immortal Stourhead 10K is licensed by the ARC and has been permitted accordingly.

The route may be subject to late changes due to unforeseen bad weather or tree felling.

The first 2K and the final 1K are on public highway. We will have measures in place to control traffic at the start of the race. On return to the highway in Stourton Village the roads will be open so please exercise appropriate caution. The use of personal stereos, iPods, phones, or any other music device is not allowed on any part of the course. Runners seen wearing headphones will be disqualified by the Event Organisers.

Cupless Racing

In our ongoing quest to reduce plastic at running events, the Stourhead 10K will be a cupless event. There will be no drink station on the route. You will need to carry your own pre-filled drinking vessel. Water in souvenir cups will be available at the finish.

Awards Presentation

There will be a beautiful medal, souvenir cup and free race photos for all finishers. Trophies for the top three male and top three female finishers will be presented near the finish line outside Stourhead House once the top three in each gender have finished the race. There will also be age category trophies which will be posted out within one month of the race weekend.
